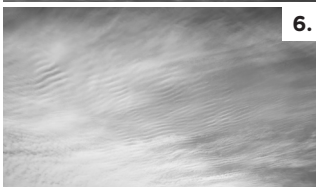
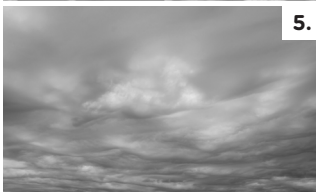
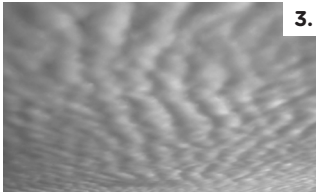

Do you know your clouds?

Match the image of each cloud to its description by drawing a line between them.



a. Stratus clouds cover the entire sky like a big grey blanket. They can be rain-free, or they can cause periods of light rain or drizzle.

b. Cumulus clouds are the big puffy white clouds that look like floating cotton. Known as fair weather clouds, they usually do not produce any rain.

c. Cirrus clouds are wispy clouds that form when water vapour turns into ice crystals high in the sky. They are the most common high-level clouds and often signal an approaching warm front.

d. Cirrostratus clouds cover the sky, but aren't as thick as Stratus clouds. Instead they form more of a veil-like layer because of their high altitude.

e. Nimbostratus clouds are generally thick and dense like Stratus clouds, but are known for producing steady rain or even snow so they can appear much darker.

f. Cumulonimbus clouds look like tall, puffy towers, and they produce heavy rain. When you see these clouds, get ready for a thunderstorm and maybe even lightning.
